



What is matched giving?

A matched giving period is a short timeframe when donations are matched dollar-for-dollar by a matched giving fund. This fund can be one donor or a group of donors whose donations are pooled together, who have offered to match any donations given during the matched giving period up to a certain amount.

How does matched giving work for this campaign?

Two of our generous donors have agreed for their donation to Chris O'Brien Lifehouse to be used to match donations from the community. From 8am to 8pm (AEST) on 24th June 2026 (or until the matched funds are exhausted) every dollar given in one off donation will be matched, up to a total of \$75,000.

This means that when you give \$50, an additional \$50 will be unlocked to support specialist nurses at Chris O'Brien Lifehouse.

Is there a maximum donation amount that will be matched?

During the matched giving period, the largest donation that can be matched is \$10,000. This ensures as many people as possible can have their donation matched.

What happens when the matched fund is exhausted?

Once the target has been reached, we'll let you know that the fund has been exhausted on our webpage. Any donations that are received after the fund has finished will still go towards supporting specialist nurses at Chris O'Brien Lifehouse but they will not be matched.

In the unlikely event that a donor decides to no longer provide the matching gift donation, the campaign will not go ahead. If the matched giving period has already started, we will cease immediately and advise anyone who has already donated during the matched giving period via email.

Is my gift tax deductible if I give during matched giving?

Yes! All donations over \$2 are tax deductible. We'll send you a receipt shortly after we receive your donation for your records.
